SYNOPSIS OF LAWS ENACTED BY CHAPTER

- Chapter 1** **OPERATION OF LOW-SPEED VEHICLES**
Allows the operation of low-speed vehicles on highways with a maximum speed limit of 45 miles per hour if the highway is within (1) the unorganized borough, outside of a city, and is not connected by road to Anchorage or Fairbanks, or (2) a municipality that has adopted an ordinance allowing the use of the vehicles and the municipality has a population of less than 35,000 and is not connected by road to Anchorage or Fairbanks. Also allows low-speed vehicles to cross highways at intersections. (HCS CSSB 59(TRA))
- Effective Date: May 17, 2010

- Chapter 2** **PURPLE HEART DAY**
Establishes August 7 of each year as Purple Heart Day to honor recipients of the Purple Heart. (HB 274)
- Effective Date: June 20, 2010

- Chapter 3** **AMENDING DESCRIPTION OF PARCELS IN THE FORT ROUSSEAU CAUSEWAY STATE HISTORICAL PARK**
Removes land that lies within a certain distance from the Sitka Airport runway from the Fort Rousseau Causeway State Historical Park. (CSHB 276(CRA))
- Effective Date: March 31, 2010

- Chapter 4** **JURISDICTION OF DISTRICT JUDGES AND MAGISTRATES TO ISSUE SEXUAL ASSAULT PROTECTIVE ORDERS**
Provides district judges and magistrates with the authority to issue sexual assault protective orders. (HB 307)
- Effective Date: June 29, 2010

Chapter 5 **SUICIDE PREVENTION COUNCIL**
Authorizes the Suicide Prevention Council to participate in meetings and to vote by teleconference. (HB 349)

Effective Date: July 13, 2010

Chapter 6 **WILLIAM JACK HERNANDEZ SPORT FISH HATCHERY**
Names the state fish hatchery under construction on the Elmendorf Air Force Base the William Jack Hernandez Sport Fish Hatchery. (CSSB 274(RES))

Effective Date: July 20, 2010

Chapter 7 **NATURAL GAS PIPELINE PROJECTS**
Creates the position of in-state gasline project coordinator in the Office of the Governor and a Joint In-State Gasline Development Team with duties relating to an in-state natural gas pipeline project. Provides that the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation shall be granted a right-of-way lease for the gas pipeline transportation corridor if certain conditions are met, and authorizes the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation to create a subsidiary for in-state natural gas pipeline projects. Limits an exemption from AS 38.35 (Alaska Right-of-Way Leasing Act) for natural gas carriers. (SCS CSHB 369(FIN))

Effective Date: April 27, 2010

Chapter 8 **ALASKA EMPLOYMENT SECURITY ACT EXEMPTION FOR VOLUNTEERS OFFICIATING AT SPORTS EVENTS**
Exempts sports officials who are neutral participants in a sporting event, including umpires, referees, judges, scorekeepers, timekeepers, and organizers, from certain requirements of the Alaska Employment Security Act for certain work at sports events in which the competitors are not paid a wage or salary and for which the sports official's compensation does not exceed \$1,500 a year and is paid only to defray or reimburse certain related expenses incurred by the official. (HB 377)

Effective Date: July 29, 2010

Chapter 9 **MOTORCYCLE AND MOTOR SCOOTER AWARENESS MONTH**
Establishes the month of May as motorcycle and motor scooter awareness month. (CSHB 262(TRA))

Effective Date: July 30, 2010

Chapter 10 **MUNICIPAL PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS**

Provides a temporary exemption from municipal property taxes for certain interests created by a nonexclusive use agreement with the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority. Provides an exemption for property owned by certain private, nonprofit colleges or universities subject to a private interest on January 1, 2010, except that the holder of the private interest shall be taxed; modifies that exemption beginning on December 31, 2035, for property owned by certain private, nonprofit colleges or universities, allowing a private interest in the property to be taxable. Permits a municipality to grant an exemption, subject to voter approval, for the primary residence of the widow or widower under 60 years of age of a disabled veteran who had qualified for the exemption. Permits a municipality to provide for an exemption from property taxes for certain residences of law enforcement officers. (SCS CSHB 10(FIN) am S(reengrossed))

Effective Date: Sections 1 and 6 take effect May 2, 2010; section 2 takes effect November 30, 2012; section 3 takes effect December 31, 2035; remainder of Act takes effect July 30, 2010; AS 29.45.030(a)(1)(A), as amended by section 1, is retroactive to November 30, 2009

Chapter 11 **FARM-TO-SCHOOL PROGRAM; SCHOOL GARDENS, GREENHOUSES, AND FARMS**

Establishes a farm-to-school program to increase public school use of fruit, vegetables, meat, and dairy products produced in the state, to educate students on the benefits of using food produced in the state, and to encourage school gardens, school farms, and farm visits. Allows school districts to authorize or operate school gardens, greenhouses, and farms. (CSHB 70(FIN))

Effective Date: August 2, 2010

Chapter 12 **RESIDENTIAL SHELTERS FOR RUNAWAY MINORS**

Requires a licensed residential shelter program for runaway minors to provide for the bed capacity that is designated on the state license. (SB 307)

Effective Date: August 2, 2010

Chapter 13 **SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes supplemental and other appropriations, amends appropriations, repeals appropriations, and capitalizes funds. (CSHB 326(FIN))

Effective Date: May 9, 2010; section 7 is retroactive to June 30, 2009

Chapter 14 **POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS**

Establishes, in 2011, a statewide merit scholarship program for high school graduates who meet specified curriculum, grade, and testing criteria. Provides for maximum annual award limits that may be used at a college or approved career program in the state. Requires an annual report to the Legislature. Raises the annual limit for an existing needs based grant for postsecondary education from \$2,000 to \$3,000. Requires the postsecondary education commission to provide funding under the professional student exchange program to a minimum number of students in dentistry, optometry, and pharmacy programs. Establishes two temporary task forces in the legislative branch: one for postsecondary scholarship advice and one for postsecondary college and career readiness review and recommendations. **(HCS CSSB 221(FIN))**

Effective Date: Sections 3, 4, 6, and 8 - 11 take effect May 11, 2010;
 remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2011

Chapter 15 **TAX TREATMENT OF NATURAL GAS**

Increases the percentage of a qualified capital investment or cost of qualified services for a gas reserve that may be taken as an income tax credit. Increases the amount of credit that may be allowed relative to the amount of the taxpayer's total tax liability. Prohibits a person from including the cost of any qualified capital investment or qualified service that has been offset by a credit in the rate base for a regulated facility. Prohibits a cost that is the basis for the income tax credit from being the basis for a credit against the oil and gas production tax or for a royalty modification. Allows a qualified capital investment to be the basis for a credit regardless of whether there has been commercial production in the area or whether the exploration activity resulted in production in commercial quantities or a well not capable of production in commercial quantities. Describes the property that may be the subject of a qualified capital investment. States when the income tax credit may be claimed. Delays the date interest begins to accrue on an underpayment or overpayment of an oil and gas production tax that results from the retroactive effect of a regulation. Provides for an oil and gas production tax credit of 80, 90, or 100 percent of exploration expenditures associated with the drilling of exploration wells from a jack-up rig in Cook Inlet, and the repayment to the state of a portion of the credit if the exploration well results in the sustained production of oil or gas. Extends the period for claiming an income tax credit for gas exploration and development. **(HCS CSSB 309(FIN))**

Effective Date: Section 8 is retroactive to January 1, 2006; section 12 takes
 effect July 1, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect May 11,
 2010

Chapter 16 **REGULATION AND TAXATION OF GAS STORAGE FACILITIES**

Requires the Alaska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission to certify the capacity and withdrawal capability of a gas storage facility that is the basis for a tax credit or exemption from a lease payment obligation. Requires the director of the division of lands to expedite, when reasonably possible, lease transactions relating to a gas storage facility. Authorizes the commissioner of natural resources to exempt a gas storage facility from the payment of fees or rental payments. Requires the Regulatory Commission of Alaska to recognize the public benefits of different pricing mechanisms between gas suppliers and utilities, and to consider the effect of failing to approve a gas supply contract proposed by a utility. Requires the exemption from lease expenditures and income tax credits to be considered by the Regulatory Commission of Alaska when calculating costs that are allowed in determining rates. Exempts certain natural gas storage services from regulation by the Regulatory Commission of Alaska. Provides for an income tax credit for a gas storage facility that is based on the working gas storage capacity of the facility. Authorizes a refund for a gas storage facility credit that exceeds a person's tax liability. Removes the requirement that certain tax credits be applied before applying the production tax limitations applicable to oil and gas produced in Cook Inlet and gas used in the state that is produced outside of the Cook Inlet sedimentary basin. Provides for the tax treatment of gas in a gas storage facility. Provides for special credits for well lease expenditures incurred in the state south of 68 degrees North latitude and the issuance of transferable tax credit certificates for those credits. Requires the Department of Revenue to adopt regulations for allocating payments for tax credits and refunds when the amount of money available in the oil and gas tax credit fund is insufficient to pay the full amount of all claims. Requires the attorney general to consider whether participation is in the public interest when the Regulatory Commission of Alaska is considering different price mechanisms in gas supply contracts and when considering the impact from denying a proposed contract for the purchase of gas by a utility. (SCS CSHB 280(FIN))

Effective Date: May 13, 2010

Chapter 17 **STATE DOG DESIGNATED**

Designates the Alaskan Malamute as the official state dog. (CSHB 14(STA))

Effective Date: August 10, 2010

Chapter 18 **CRIMINAL LAW AND PROCEDURE MATTERS**

Makes changes to the crimes of harassment, distribution of child pornography, possession of child pornography, failure to register as a sex offender or child kidnapper, violation by sex offender of condition of probation, and distribution of indecent material to a minor. Restricts a court from suspending the imposition of sentence for certain crimes. Makes changes to conditions of sentence and to aggravating factors at sentencing. Amends the definition of sex offense for purposes

of sex offender registration. Requires the Department of Public Safety to set requirements for minimum reporting of uniform crime information. Authorizes the attorney general to issue subpoenas for certain information relating to Internet service accounts when there is reasonable cause to believe that the account has been used in the exploitation or attempted exploitation of children.

(CSSB 222(JUD)(ct rule fld H))

Effective Date: July 1, 2010

Chapter 19 CRIMINAL PROCEDURE MATTERS; CONDITIONS OF CRIMINAL SENTENCES; SERVICE OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE PROTECTIVE ORDERS

Amends statutes and court rules relating to bail, pre- and post-trial release, pre-sentence and post-conviction release, release of material witnesses, and third party custodians. Creates a new crime of failure to appear after being admitted to bail or release. Allows a court as a condition of sentence to require a person to refrain from consuming alcoholic beverages. Makes changes to the procedure for service of process for domestic violence petitions and orders. Makes changes to statutes and court rules relating to a person's initial appearance before a court after the person's arrest. **(SCS CSHB 324(JUD))**

Effective Date: July 1, 2010

Chapter 20 PRESERVATION OF EVIDENCE, POST-CONVICTION DNA TESTING, AND THE DNA DATABASE

Requires law enforcement agencies and the Alaska Court System to preserve certain types of evidence, and provides procedures related to that preservation and to subsequent testing and disposal of the evidence. Allows persons convicted of certain crimes to apply for an order for DNA testing of evidence and provides procedures relating to that application and testing. Makes changes to the DNA identification registration system. Creates a task force on standards and training of evidence technicians. **(HCS CSSB 110(FIN))**

Effective Date: July 1, 2010

Chapter 21 TRANSPORTATION SERVICES INDEMNIFICATION AGREEMENTS

Prohibits a motor carrier and a shipper from agreeing that the motor carrier will indemnify, defend, or hold the shipper harmless from liability for the negligence, intentional acts, or intentional omissions of the shipper. Prohibits a motor carrier and a shipper from agreeing that the shipper will indemnify, defend, or hold the motor carrier harmless from liability for the negligence, intentional acts, or intentional omissions of the motor carrier. Limits the application to motor vehicles having over

a specified gross weight rating. Makes the agreement void and unenforceable. Exempts agreements that relate to the use of intermodal chassis, containers, and equipment. (CSHB 366(JUD))

Effective Date: August 25, 2010

Chapter 22 PERMANENT FUND DIVIDENDS

Permits the personal representatives or successors claiming personal property to apply for and receive the permanent fund dividends of certain people who die during the qualifying year. Requires the Department of Revenue to maintain an electronic database for the permanent fund dividend contribution list that permits searches by organization name, geographic location, and type. Permits an organization to appear on the contribution list only if it files an application before March 31 of the qualifying year, and alters qualifications for certain organizations. Sets an application fee of \$250 for an organization that files an application to appear on the contribution list. Prevents a community foundation from depositing contributions into a donor advised fund. (HCS CSSB 171(FIN))

Effective Date: Sections 1 - 8 take effect January 1, 2011; remainder of Act takes effect August 25, 2010

Chapter 23 ALASKA FIREARMS FREEDOM ACT

Establishes the Alaska Firearms Freedom Act. Sets state policy and makes various declarations regarding certain firearms. Provides that the attorney general may defend a citizen of Alaska accused of a violation of federal law regarding a firearm that is the subject of the Act. (CSHB 186(FIN) am)

Effective Date: August 25, 2010

Chapter 24 COMPLETION OF FEDERAL FIREARMS FORMS AND CONCEALED HANDGUN PERMIT PROVISIONS

Makes various changes to the provisions relating to applications for concealed handgun permits and to concealed handgun permittees. Requires chief executive officers of municipal police departments and the head of the Alaska State Troopers to execute federal firearms forms for a person required to submit the forms if the person is qualified to possess the firearm. (CSHB 319(FIN))

Effective Date: AS 18.65.725(f), added by section 3 of this Act, takes effect July 1, 2012; remainder of Act takes effect August 25, 2010

Chapter 25 **GOLDSTREAM PUBLIC USE AREA**

Repeals sec. 2, ch. 48, SLA 1990, a provision that would have terminated the Goldstream Public Use Area, effective July 1, 2010. (SB 195)

Effective Date: August 25, 2010

Chapter 26 **LICENSING OF PSYCHOLOGISTS AND PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSOCIATES**

Amends the qualifications required to take a psychological associates examination. Modifies who may practice psychology or hold out publicly as a psychologist in Alaska without being licensed in the state. (CSHB 110(HSS))

Effective Date: August 30, 2010

Chapter 27 **OPTOMETRIST LICENSING**

Amends the qualifications for licensure as an optometrist. Requires a person who fails the optometrist licensure examination to retake the entire exam. Establishes additional continuing education requirements for renewal of an optometrist license. Permits an optometrist who meets the amended licensure requirements, or who had the appropriate license endorsement on or before the effective date of the Act, to prescribe and use certain pharmaceutical agents in the practice of optometry. Creates two new categories of licensure for optometrists, restricted licenses and retired status licenses. (HB 245)

Effective Date: June 2, 2010

Chapter 28 **ELECTRONIC VOTING PROCEDURES FOR ELECTRIC AND TELEPHONE COOPERATIVES**

Provides an option for voting by electronic transmission by a member of an electric or telephone cooperative if the cooperative's bylaws so provide. (CSHB 336(STA))

Effective Date: June 2, 2010

Chapter 29 **CITATIONS FOR LAW VIOLATIONS: UNIFORM CITATION FORMAT AND PROCEDURE AND PENALTIES FOR NOT COMPLYING WITH CITATIONS**

Establishes a uniform format and uniform procedures for the issuance of citations for violations of law or ordinance. Establishes penalties for failure to comply with a citation. Makes numerous conforming changes. (CSHB 386(FIN))

Effective Date: Sections 8 and 24 are conditional; section 62 takes effect June 2, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2010

Chapter 30 **REGULATIONS OF THE ALASKA STATE COUNCIL ON THE ARTS**
Authorizes the Alaska State Council on the Arts to adopt regulations relating to its powers and duties. (SB 209)

Effective Date: June 2, 2010

Chapter 31 **BOARD OF PHARMACY**
Extends the termination date of the Board of Pharmacy to June 30, 2018. (CSSB 247(L&C))

Effective Date: June 2, 2010

Chapter 32 **BOARD OF MARITAL AND FAMILY THERAPY**
Extends the termination date of the Board of Marital and Family Therapy to June 30, 2014. (CSSB 248(L&C))

Effective Date: June 2, 2010

Chapter 33 **BOARD OF SOCIAL WORK EXAMINERS**
Extends the termination date of the Board of Social Work Examiners to June 30, 2018. (SB 262)

Effective Date: June 2, 2010

Chapter 34 **BOARD OF PROFESSIONAL COUNSELORS**
Extends the termination date of the Board of Professional Counselors to June 30, 2018. (SB 263)

Effective Date: June 2, 2010

Chapter 35 **ALASKA HOUSING FINANCE CORPORATION DIVIDEND TO THE STATE**
Amends the definition of the phrase "adjusted change in net assets" for purposes of the formula under which the amount of a dividend is calculated that is payable annually by the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation to the state. (SB 270)

Effective Date: June 20, 2010

Chapter 36 **STATE ELECTION CAMPAIGNS: EXPENDITURES, CONTRIBUTIONS, AND COMMUNICATIONS**

Amends state laws relating to contributions, expenditures, and communications in state election campaigns to apply the laws to all legal persons. Conforms state laws to the U. S. Supreme Court's ruling in Citizens United v. F. E. C. by permitting certain citizens and domestic corporations to make independent expenditures in state elections. Amends the duties of the Alaska Public Offices Commission. Requires a person making an independent expenditure to report all expenditures made and contributions received to the commission, and specifies the information to be reported and the deadlines for filing the reports. Sets out definitions for the purposes of those reports. Requires a person making independent expenditures in a state election to establish, and draw all funds used for independent expenditures from, a political activities account that meets certain accounting and record keeping requirements. Prohibits foreign nationals from making expenditures and contributions in state elections. Permits certain charitable gaming permittees to use the proceeds of a raffle or lottery to make expenditures to aid candidates for public office, political parties, or groups or organizations affiliated with a political party. Requires a person paying for a communication in a state election to provide the person's address or the person's place of business. Requires a person other than an individual or a candidate paying for a communication to include the name and title of the person's principal officer, a statement from the officer approving the communication, and the names of the person's three contributors of the largest amounts, if any, in a communication. Directs how certain communication disclaimer requirements must be satisfied in print, video, and audio media, and how certain contributors of equal amounts may be identified in a communication. Provides that the officers of a person paying for a communication are liable for defamatory statements of material fact in a communication. **(HCS CSSB 284(FIN) am H)**

Effective Date: June 2, 2010

Chapter 37 **REGULATORY COMMISSION OF ALASKA: RENEWABLE ENERGY EXEMPTION**

Exempts from regulation by the Regulatory Commission of Alaska generators of electricity from renewable energy that sell to regulated utilities and meet other requirements. **(HCS CSSB 277(L&C))**

Effective Date: August 31, 2010

Chapter 38 **GEOHERMAL RESOURCES AND GEOHERMAL LEASES**

Grants the Alaska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission jurisdiction over geothermal wells to prevent waste, to protect correlative rights, and to ensure public safety. Continues the authority of the Department of Natural Resources over management of geothermal leases and units in the public interest and to effect development. Sets a royalty rate for geothermal leases during the first 10-year period

and a different rate applicable after the first 10-year period. Imposes a regulatory cost charge for geothermal wells. (HCS CSSB 243(RES))

Effective Date: Section 20 takes effect June 3, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2010

Chapter 39 GRANTS TO VICTIMS OF A DISASTER

Authorizes the Governor, when the Governor but not the President declares a disaster emergency, to make a grant not to exceed one-half of the maximum grant amount established in federal law for major disasters declared by the President. (HB 292)

Effective Date: June 3, 2010

Chapter 40 EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE TRANSPORTATION

Authorizes the Governor to use state-owned and state-operated transportation facilities, aircraft, vessels of the Alaska Marine Highway system, or railroad rolling stock of the Alaska Railroad to deliver compassionate aid for distribution to an area if the Governor first determines that public safety or health conditions in that area require emergency assistance. (SCS CSHB 114(TRA))

Effective Date: August 31, 2010

Chapter 41 OPERATING AND LOAN PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS

Makes appropriations for state fiscal year 2011 for the operating and loan program expenses of state government, for certain programs, and to capitalize funds. (CCS HB 300)

Effective Date: Sections 35 and 37 take effect June 30, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2010; those portions of the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2010 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2010, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2010, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance

Chapter 42 MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS

Makes appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of the state's integrated comprehensive mental health program for state fiscal year 2011. (CCS HB 302)

Effective Date: July 1, 2010

Chapter 43 **CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes and amends appropriations, including capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, fund capitalizations, and other appropriations.

(HCS CSSB 230(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: Sections 16 and 57, and the appropriations made in sections 23(c), 23(d), 24(d), 29(c), 30(a), 36, and 38 are conditional; sections 1, 4, 10, 29(c), 31, 32(b), 34, 37, 38(a), 58, and 60 take effect June 4, 2010; sections 29(a), 29(b), 33, and 39 - 56 take effect June 30, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2010; sections 29(c) and 38(a) are retroactive to March 1, 2010

Chapter 44 **CUSTODY AND VISITATION OF MILITARY CHILDREN**

Requires a court to apply special procedures and considerations for awarding custody and visitation of children whose parent is deployed to active duty military service. Provides for delegation of parent visitation rights in certain circumstances and for consideration of domestic violence. Allows for a temporary modification of a custody or visitation order during the deployment with special contact requirements, and for resumption of the permanent order after deployment. Amends relevant court rules for expedited and telephonic participation in court hearings.

(CSHB 334(RLS)(efd add S))

Effective Date: June 5, 2010

Chapter 45 **PROCUREMENT PREFERENCE FOR ALASKA VETERANS**

Establishes in the state procurement code a five percent bidder preference for entities that qualify as Alaska veteran businesses. Applies this preference to procurement by bidding and to procurement by proposals. Adds this preference to other preferences for which the entities qualify. **(CSHB 24(MLV))**

Effective Date: September 2, 2010

Chapter 46 **ALASKA HOUSING FINANCE CORPORATION BONDS AND FACILITIES**

Authorizes the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation to issue revenue bonds, secured by the state, in an amount of not more than \$600,000,000 for veterans' housing loans. Directs that the question of the state guarantee of the bonds be submitted to the voters. Authorizes the corporation to acquire the building that it occupies for an amount not to exceed \$14,500,000 and to acquire a building or site for relocation of its public housing client intake and assisted housing center for an amount that does not exceed \$3,500,000. **(CSSB 217(FIN))**

Effective Date: June 5, 2010

Chapter 47 **USE, OPERATION, AND REGULATION OF BOATS**

Extends the termination date of provisions relating to the use, operation, and regulation of boats, a uniform state waterway marking system, and civil liability for boat owners to July 1, 2013. (CSHB 294(FIN))

Effective Date: June 5, 2010

Chapter 48 **LICENSING OF SPORT FISHING OPERATORS AND GUIDES**

Extends the termination date of provisions related to the licensing of sport fishing operators and sport fishing guides to January 1, 2012. (HCS CSSB 294(FIN))

Effective Date: June 5, 2010

Chapter 49 **REGULATION OF PAWNBROKERS**

Establishes new provisions for licensing and regulating pawnbrokers. Requires a pawnbroker to be licensed. Prohibits a pawn transaction from exceeding \$750, excluding fees. Prohibits pawnbroker transactions with certain persons, including minors. Requires a pawnbroker to provide pledgors and sellers with transaction agreements. Sets a limit on the finance fee that a pawnbroker may charge for a pawn transaction. Allows a pawnbroker to charge a processing fee, a firearm processing fee, and a governmental fee. Allows a pledgor to redeem pledged property unless there is a hold order on the property, the property is subject to a claim, or the property is returned to a lessor. Establishes special rules for pawn transactions relating to military personnel who are deployed abroad for service relating to a military conflict. Provides for the issuance of police hold orders and evidentiary hold orders. Allows a person to make a claim on pawnbroker-held property that was misappropriated from the person and to delay its disposal. Allows a lessor to recover pawnbroker-held property that was leased to the pledgor or seller. Requires a pawnbroker to provide law enforcement reports on a weekly basis. When the investigation case number is provided, prohibits a pawnbroker from refusing to allow a law enforcement agency to inspect the register and the property subject to the investigation. Allows disciplinary action to be taken against a licensee for a violation of the new requirements. Makes a licensee liable to the state for a civil penalty if the licensee violates the new requirements. Allows a municipality with the requisite authority to regulate pawnbrokers, but prohibits certain regulations. Exempts state-regulated and federal financial institutions. Excludes pawnbrokers from the regulation of small loans when their separate and individual loans do not exceed \$750. Defines "pawnbroker" for certain Uniform Commercial Code exceptions. (HCS CSSB 292(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: Section 8 takes effect June 5, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2011

Chapter 50 **CHARGES FOR RENTED MOTOR VEHICLES**

Requires a rental car business to separately identify and charge for any cost recovery fees in the rental car agreement. Prohibits a rental car business from charging a vehicle licensing cost recovery fee unless the fee represents a good faith estimate of the average daily licensing cost during the calendar year. Indicates how a business is to handle any amount collected that exceeds the actual licensing costs. (SB 272)

Effective Date: September 5, 2010

Chapter 51 **LIEN TIME PERIOD EXTENSIONS**

Lengthens two time periods that are related to certain liens for providing labor, material, service, or equipment to real property. (HB 253)

Effective Date: September 7, 2010

Chapter 52 **USE OF EPINEPHRINE IN EMERGENCY SITUATIONS**

Requires the Department of Health and Social Services to adopt standards for training programs relating to the use of epinephrine in emergency situations. Permits certain persons to obtain a prescription for, and administer, epinephrine in emergency situations. Limits the liability of certain persons who administer epinephrine to another individual in an emergency situation. (CSHB 277(HSS))

Effective Date: September 7, 2010

Chapter 53 **BOARD OF CERTIFIED REAL ESTATE APPRAISERS**

Extends the termination date of the Board of Certified Real Estate Appraisers to June 30, 2014. (HB 342)

Effective Date: June 10, 2010

Chapter 54 **CRIMINAL FINES FOR ORGANIZATIONS**

Increases the fines that may be imposed upon an organization that is convicted of a crime. (CSHB 355(JUD))

Effective Date: September 7, 2010

Chapter 55 **BOARD OF PSYCHOLOGIST AND PSYCHOLOGICAL ASSOCIATE EXAMINERS**

Extends the termination date for the Board of Psychologist and Psychological Associate Examiners to June 30, 2018. (HB 376)

Effective Date: June 10, 2010

Chapter 56 **COMPENSATION OF PUBLIC OFFICERS, OFFICIALS, AND EMPLOYEES WHO ARE NOT COVERED BY COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENTS**

Increases compensation of judges, justices, employees of the Legislature, and most executive branch employees and public officers who are in the exempt service and are not members of a collective bargaining unit established under state law by raising their salaries by two percent on each of July 1, 2010, July 1, 2011, and July 1, 2012. Authorizes salary increases for certain employees of the University of Alaska. (HB 421)

Effective Date: July 1, 2010

Chapter 57 **STATE VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION COMMITTEE**

Repeals the Governor's Committee on Employment of People with Disabilities and establishes in its place the State Vocational Rehabilitation Committee to promote employment of people of the state with disabilities. (CSSB 83(L&C))

Effective Date: June 10, 2010

Chapter 58 **CORRECTIVE AMENDMENTS: 2010 REVISOR'S BILL**

Makes corrective amendments to various Alaska Statutes as recommended by the revisor of statutes. (HCS CSSB 265(JUD))

Effective Date: Section 22 is conditional; remainder of Act takes effect June 10, 2010; section 15 is retroactive to June 21, 2009

Chapter 59 **MUSK OXEN TAG AND FEE**

Authorizes the Board of Game to reduce or eliminate the resident big game tag and fee for musk oxen in a game management unit. Removes a provision limiting a person to eligibility for one musk oxen permit a year. (CSSB 144(FIN))

Effective Date: September 7, 2010

Chapter 60 **MEDICAID COVERAGE FOR DENTURES**

Authorizes the Department of Health and Social Services to pay the maximum dental benefit under medical assistance for a two-year period during one fiscal year for dentures approved for an eligible recipient. (SB 199)

Effective Date: September 7, 2010

Chapter 61 **RESIDENTIAL MORTGAGE LENDING**

Revises the chapter that regulates mortgage lending to comply with the requirements of the federal Secure and Fair Enforcement for Mortgage Licensing Act of 2008 (SAFE Act). Prohibits, with respect to a dwelling in the state, a person from operating in the state as a mortgage lender or a mortgage broker, and an individual from operating as a mortgage loan originator, unless the person or individual is licensed or exempt under the chapter. Requires an individual required to be licensed as a mortgage loan originator to register with the SAFE Act registry, to maintain a valid unique identifier issued by the SAFE Act registry, and to meet other requirements. Prohibits an independent contractor from operating as a loan processor or underwriter unless licensed as a mortgage loan originator under the chapter. Establishes certain exemptions from the chapter's licensing requirements. Authorizes the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development to participate in the SAFE Act registry. Requires license applicants to furnish specified information for background checks, including fingerprints, and directs the department or the SAFE Act registry to submit fingerprints for a criminal history background check and obtain independent credit reports. Establishes prelicensing education requirements for mortgage loan originators. Requires applicants for mortgage loan originator licenses to pass a qualified written test. Directs the department to establish bond amounts for licenses. Requires the department to make certain determinations about an applicant before granting a license. Sets the procedures and standards for renewal of a license. Requires mortgage licensees to file annual reports with the department. Establishes continuing education requirements for mortgage loan originators. Describes the disciplinary action that the department may take against a person subject to the chapter, including stopping the conduct of business, imposing a fine, and issuing an order of rescission, restitution, or disgorgement. Describes the investigation and examination authority of the department. Directs the department to report violations of the chapter to the SAFE Act registry. Lists specific activities that are prohibited for a licensee. (HCS CSSB 279(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 90 takes effect June 10, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2010

Chapter 62 **REAL PROPERTY FORECLOSURES AND DEEDS OF TRUST; PROPERTY EXECUTION SALES**

Requires that Internet notice be given for the sale of real property on execution. Describes the qualifications of an Internet website for giving the notice, and allows a person to bring a court action to establish that the person qualifies. Requires that the notice of default for a deed of trust describe the conditions for curing the default. Clarifies who is entitled to receive the notice of default and how delivery may be made. Describes how to provide notice when a person entitled to the notice is deceased. Lists who may bring a court action to stop a foreclosure on real property. Requires that foreclosure proceeds be placed in a trust account. Allows a trustee to accept bids by telephone, the Internet, and electronic mail. Requires that a trustee give a new notice of a foreclosure sale in order to postpone a foreclosure for more

than 12 months. Describes how a trustee is to distribute sales proceeds. Allows the trustee to rescind a foreclosure sale under certain conditions. Requires a trustee to obtain a surety bond to protect trustors and beneficiaries of trust deeds, but exempts a state agency and a licensed attorney from this requirement.

(SCS CSHB 108(JUD) am S)

Effective Date: September 7, 2010

Chapter 63 UNIFORM DISCLAIMER OF PROPERTY INTERESTS ACT

Adopts the Uniform Disclaimer of Property Interests Act to provide rules for making disclaimers to refuse property interests or powers over property interests. Describes the formal requirements to make a disclaimer. Indicates when a disclaimer becomes irrevocable. Establishes when a disclaimer becomes effective. Generally permits the making of a disclaimer unless the disclaimer is barred by certain listed provisions, including a provision related to child support. Coordinates disclaimers under the Act with provisions of the federal Internal Revenue Code. **(CSHB 287(JUD))**

Effective Date: September 7, 2010

Chapter 64 UNIFORM PROBATE CODE AMENDMENTS

Makes changes to the state's Uniform Probate Code. With regard to an order binding others in proceedings under the Code, provides that certain trust beneficiaries are bound by an order that binds a person designated in a trust instrument to represent and bind them, and provides that certain persons binding other persons are not liable to the beneficiaries, or to persons claiming through the beneficiaries, for good faith actions or omissions. Under certain conditions, excludes from an augmented estate the property transferred to an irrevocable trust with a transfer restriction. Allows specified persons to petition the court to determine the validity of a will before the testator's death or a trust before the settlor's death. Makes the court's declaration of validity binding on other persons. Establishes that certain records related to the petition are confidential. Allows a trust or will to be changed, revoked, or terminated after the court's declaration. Allows personal representatives and trustees to consider discretionary distributions to a beneficiary as being made from capital gains realized during the year. **(CSSB 60(L&C))**

Effective Date: September 7, 2010

Chapter 65 TRANSFERS OF TRUST INTERESTS

Requires that whenever the transfer of a beneficiary's trust interest is restricted, if a creditor wants to make a claim based on an intent to defraud, the creditor must establish the intent to defraud by clear and convincing evidence. Allows and provides for the enforceability of a trust transfer restriction even if the settlor may still appoint or remove certain persons, including trustees. Provides for the

enforceability of a trust transfer restriction against a creditor if the beneficiary has the right to receive discretionary trust distributions or if, under certain conditions, the settlor will or does receive distributions to pay income taxes on the trust. (CSSB 63(JUD))

Effective Date: September 7, 2010

Chapter 66 **UNIFORM PRUDENT MANAGEMENT OF INSTITUTIONAL FUNDS ACT**
Adopts the Uniform Prudent Management of Institutional Funds Act to provide guidance for the management and investment of money by institutions, including governmental institutions, for charitable purposes. Requires an institution, when managing and investing an institutional fund, to consider the institution's charitable purposes and the fund's purposes, subject to the donor's intent. Establishes standards of conduct and provides management and investment rules. Allows an institution to pool funds. Allows an institution, subject to the donor's intent, to appropriate for expenditure or to accumulate as much of an endowment fund as is prudent for the fund. Generally allows an institution to delegate the management and investment of an endowment fund to an outside agent if prudent. Addresses when gift restrictions may be changed. Directs that compliance with the new provisions be determined in light of existing circumstances. Indicates how the Act applies to the University of Alaska. (HB 416)

Effective Date: September 8, 2010

Chapter 67 **PUBLIC ACCOUNTING PRACTICE AMENDMENTS**
Makes changes to the licensing chapter that deals with public accounting. Requires that an executive secretary be employed for the Board of Public Accountancy. Establishes the eligibility requirements for partnerships, corporations, and limited liability companies to receive permits to engage in the practice of public accounting. Requires that a legal entity with a permit that does not comply with the ownership requirements take corrective action to comply. Establishes when an individual may engage in the practice of public accounting under a practice privilege. Allows certain qualifying legal entities to engage in the practice of public accounting under out-of-state permits. Allows certain legal entities to engage in the practice of public accounting under out-of-state exemptions. Sets certain conditions for practice privileges, out-of-state permits, and out-of-state exemptions relating to compliance with the chapter, consent to jurisdiction of the board, and consent to the appointment of an agent for service of process. Makes other changes throughout the licensing chapter to reflect these changes. (SCS HB 315(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 43 takes effect June 11, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2011

Chapter 68 **BONDS AND OTHER OBLIGATIONS**

Authorizes the state bond committee to allocate tax credit limits and tax-exempt bond limits for the state in accordance with federal law. Changes the definition of "municipal bond" for purposes of activities of the Alaska Municipal Bond Bank Authority, and raises the maximum amount of bond bank authority bonds outstanding to \$1,000,000,000. Enacts temporary law provisions applicable to recovery zone economic development bonds authorized under federal law and to waiver and reallocation of recovery zone facility bond volume cap allocations. (CSSB 269(FIN))

Effective Date: June 12, 2010

Chapter 69 **ALASKA INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND EXPORT AUTHORITY:
EXERCISE OF POWERS; FINANCING CONSIDERATIONS**

Permits the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority to consider the interests of local governments when exercising its powers. Changes the minimum rate of interest on a loan participation purchased from the assets of the Authority. Permits the Authority to establish a program to pay borrowers of loan participations incentive rate rebates to meet economic development criteria. Defines terms for purposes of use of money in the economic development account. Increases the amount of loans that may be made from the rural development initiative fund and deletes a prohibition against making another loan to a person who has not repaid the original loan. (CSSB 300(FIN))

Effective Date: September 9, 2010

Chapter 70 **POWER PROJECT FUND LOANS**

Allows the Alaska Energy Authority to sell loans of the power project fund with legislative approval and to have the proceeds appropriated into the power project fund. Authorizes the Alaska Energy Authority to establish and collect fees and charges related to loans and deposit the money into the general fund. Provides legislative approval for the Alaska Energy Authority to sell and for the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority to purchase certain loans from the power project fund. Provides legislative approval for a loan from the power project fund for the Reynolds Creek hydroelectric project. (HCS SB 301(RLS))

Effective Date: June 12, 2010

Chapter 71 **ALASKA INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND EXPORT AUTHORITY:
LIMITATIONS, RECORDS CONFIDENTIALITY, AND MUNICIPAL
TAXATION**

Establishes a municipal tax exemption for certain property of the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority. Makes this exemption retroactive to July 1,

2007, and removes the exemption November 30, 2012. Excludes refunding bonds from a limit set for issuing bonds in a 12-month period. Eliminates a sunset date for the corporation's authority to issue bonds over \$10,000,000 for development projects, and requires approval by law, except for refunding bonds. Clarifies that certain information may be considered a trade secret under the Authority's confidentiality provisions. Specifies that a person requesting confidentiality for records and information provided to the Authority must make an adequate showing that they qualify. Establishes that the Authority's executive director determines the confidentiality of certain records and information provided to the Authority. (SCS CSHB 90(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect November 30, 2012; remainder of Act takes effect June 12, 2010; AS 29.45.030(a)(1)(A), as amended by section 1 of this Act, is retroactive to July 1, 2007

Chapter 72 **MEMBERSHIP OF THE ALASKA INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT AND EXPORT AUTHORITY**

Deletes one commissioner from the Alaska Industrial Development and Export Authority and adds three public members, for a total public membership of five. Adds as qualifications that public members have expertise in private sector business or industry, and leadership skills. Provides that public members serve at the pleasure of the Governor. (CSHB 363(FIN))

Effective Date: September 9, 2010

Chapter 73 **BALLOT INITIATIVES AND BALLOT INITIATIVE PROPOSAL APPLICATIONS**

Requires a person that contributes \$500 or more to a group organized for the purpose of filing an initiative proposal application to report the person's contributions to the Alaska Public Offices Commission. Requires a person to register with the commission before making an expenditure in support or in opposition to an initiative proposal application filed with the Lieutenant Governor. Establishes new reporting requirements for persons receiving contributions, or making expenditures, exceeding \$500 in support of or in opposition to a ballot initiative or ballot initiative proposal application. Requires a group that intends to make more than 50 percent of its contributions or expenditures in support of or in opposition to a single ballot initiative to include the title or common name of the initiative in the group's name. Modifies the definitions of "contribution" and "expenditure" to include contributions received, or expenditures made, in support of or in opposition to an initiative proposal application. Expands the definition of "group" to include groups that file, or that organize for the purpose of filing, an initiative proposal application. Requires a ballot initiative petition to include a full copy of the proposed bill. Directs the Lieutenant Governor to hold public hearings concerning a ballot initiative. Requires

that an election pamphlet be prepared and disseminated for a special election at which a ballot proposition is scheduled to appear. Requires a standing committee of the Legislature to hold at least one hearing on an initiative proposition scheduled to appear on the election ballot. (SCS CSSH B 36(JUD))

Effective Date: September 9, 2010

Chapter 74 FISHING CAPACITY REDUCTION PROGRAM

Allows the Alaska Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission to release fish ticket information and records or reports of the total value purchased by each fisherman, buyer, or processor to the National Marine Fisheries Service to enforce a fee system of a fishing capacity reduction program. Requires an applicant for a fisheries business license to agree to pay any industry fee levied under a fishing capacity reduction program. Amends fisheries business license renewal standards to require the Department of Revenue to issue a fisheries business license to an applicant if the department has not received a final administrative determination against the applicant from the National Marine Fisheries Service for unpaid industry fees levied under a fishing capacity reduction. (HB 365)

Effective Date: June 12, 2010

Chapter 75 HEALTH CARE INSURERS' DENTAL CARE COVERAGE

Prohibits a health care insurer that provides coverage for dental care from limiting a fee set by a dentist for services unless the service is covered under the insurer's plan. Authorizes the insurer to offer a dentist the option of entering into a preferred provider contract that includes a fee schedule for covered services only, or a fee schedule for both covered and uncovered services. Prohibits the insurer from taking action against a dentist based on the dentist's choice of contract or refusal to enter into a preferred provider contract with an insurer. Requires the insurer to list a dentist who does not enter into a provider contract in the insurer's marketing material. (CSSB 258(L&C))

Effective Date: September 13, 2010

Chapter 76 ALASKA CAPSTONE AVIONICS REVOLVING LOAN FUND

Extends eligibility for a loan from the Alaska capstone avionics revolving loan fund to a lessee of an aircraft that logs a substantial percentage of flight hours in the state. (HB 354)

Effective Date: September 13, 2010

Chapter 77 **WORKERS' COMPENSATION: MEDICAL AND REHABILITATION INFORMATION; FUNERAL EXPENSE ALLOWANCE**

Provides for the return of employee-related medical and rehabilitation information to an employee who obtains a protective order. Limits the information relating to a claim that may be obtained to the limitation of the protective order. Increases the amount allowable for funeral expenses when a workers' compensation injury causes death. (SB 159 am H)

Effective Date: June 16, 2010

Chapter 78 **AUTHORIZING THE ALASKA RAILROAD TO SELL LAND NOT NECESSARY FOR RAILROAD PURPOSES**

Authorizes the Alaska Railroad Corporation to sell land that is not necessary for railroad purposes if the sale is in the best interests of the state. Requires public notice, an offer of first refusal to a leaseholder, and legislative approval before the sale. Requires the corporation to separately account for and report proceeds from the sale of land authorized by the Act. (CSHB 357(FIN))

Effective Date: September 13, 2010

Chapter 79 **CRIME OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS AND AGGRAVATING FACTORS AT SENTENCING FOR FELONIES**

Criminalizes bestiality as cruelty to animals. Provides that a first offense of some forms of cruelty to animals is a class C felony. Provides that repeated instances of cruelty to animals or a combination of assaultive behavior and cruelty to animals can be considered by the court as an aggravating factor at sentencing for felony crimes. (SCS CSHB 6(JUD))

Effective Date: September 13, 2010

Chapter 80 **CHILD IN NEED OF AID: STATE CUSTODY**

Authorizes a court to grant extensions of state custody over children in need of aid between the person's 19th and 21st birthdays. Provides for resumption of state custody over a person who has been released to the person's own custody until the person's 21st birthday in certain circumstances. Changes the definition of "child" to include a person who is in state custody after age 19. (CSHB 126(FIN))

Effective Date: January 1, 2011

Chapter 81 **MEDICAID: ELIGIBILITY FOR PERSONS IN A MEDICAL OR INTERMEDIATE CARE FACILITY**

Changes the eligibility income threshold from \$1,656 a month to 300 percent of the supplemental security income benefit rate for a person while in a medical or intermediate care facility. (SB 238)

Effective Date: September 13, 2010

Chapter 82 **STATE ENERGY POLICY**

Declares a state energy policy. (SCS CSHB 306(FIN) am S)

Effective Date: September 14, 2010

Chapter 83 **ALASKA SUSTAINABLE ENERGY ACT**

Creates an emerging energy technology fund and an Alaska energy efficiency revolving loan fund. Amends the provisions for a lease of state land to a public electric utility regarding renewable energy. Allows a municipality to exempt certain residential renewable energy systems from taxation. Establishes the Alaska heating assistance program. Requires the office of management and budget to collect and store state energy use data. Amends the Southeast energy fund and the alternative energy revolving loan fund. Amends provisions relating to nuclear energy production and facilities. Requires the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities to retrofit 25 percent of all public facilities by 2020 and report to the Legislature on its progress. Authorizes the issuance of bonds by the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation to make energy efficiency-related loans. Directs preparation of various reports on the feasibility of using compressed natural gas to power vehicles in the state, regarding a municipal energy improvements financing program, and an executive branch review by the Office of the Governor for improving state energy program performance. (HCS CSSB 220(FIN))

Effective Date: Section 44(b) takes effect June 17, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect September 14, 2010

Chapter 84 **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL BOARD: MISCELLANEOUS AMENDMENTS**

Changes the voting procedures of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board. Allows the Board to release information contained in the statewide database of alcohol purchases and shipments to the person who purchased the alcohol or to whom the alcohol was shipped. Extends the termination date of the Board to June 30, 2011. (HCS CSSB 234(L&C))

Effective Date: June 17, 2010

Chapter 85 **IGNITION INTERLOCK DEVICES**

Makes changes to the laws of avoidance of ignition interlock devices, driving while license suspended or revoked, driving while under the influence, and refusal to submit to a chemical test with regard to ignition interlock devices. Specifies new periods for which a person must use an ignition interlock device as a condition of sentence when a person is convicted of driving while under the influence or failure to submit to a chemical test. Provides that a court may not suspend the requirement for use of an ignition interlock device. Clarifies the duties of the commissioner of corrections with regard to ignition interlock devices. (HCS CSSB 239(JUD))

Effective Date: September 14, 2010

Chapter 86 **CIVIL DAMAGES AND CRIMINAL PENALTIES FOR PERSONS UNDER THE AGE OF 21 THAT VIOLATE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE LAWS**

Increases the amount of civil damages that a liquor licensee may recover from a person who violates laws related to alcoholic beverages at the licensee's establishment. Allows a court to require a person under the age of 21 who is convicted of an alcoholic beverage offense to participate in a "juvenile alcohol safety action program" as defined in the Act. Provides that an Alaska identification card issued to a person under 21 years of age expires 90 days after the person reaches the age of 21. (HCS CSSB 194(JUD) am H)

Effective Date: September 14, 2010

Chapter 87 **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL BOARD**

Provides that no more than two members of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board may be engaged in the same business, occupation, or profession. Requires three members to represent the general public, at least one of whom resides in a rural area. (HCS CSSB 261(STA))

Effective Date: June 17, 2010

Chapter 88 **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES**

Amends the presumption concerning sale of alcoholic beverages to allow the possession of a half-keg of malt beverages, amends the penalties relating to sending, transporting, and bringing alcoholic beverages into an area in relation to a half-keg, and amends the restriction on shipment of alcoholic beverages to allow the shipment of a half-keg of malt beverages. Amends provisions related to the crime of repeat minor consuming and habitual minor consuming. (SCS CSHB 98(FIN))

Effective Date: June 17, 2010

Chapter 89 **DESIGNATION OF VETERANS' WAY IN THE MATANUSKA-SUSITNA VALLEY**

Renames as Veterans' Way the road in the Matanuska-Susitna Valley known as Seldon Road, East Colony Schools Drive, and that portion of the road known as Bogard Road that extends east and west between Palmer and Meadow Lakes. (CSHB 226(TRA))

Effective Date: September 15, 2010

Chapter 90 **ALASKA PIONEERS' HOME RESIDENTS' PRESCRIPTION DRUG BENEFITS**

Requires the Department of Health and Social Services to accept prescription drug benefits allotted by the federal government for pioneers and veterans who reside in an Alaska Pioneers' Home or to provide comparable prescription drug benefits to them. (SB 215)

Effective Date: September 15, 2010

Chapter 91 **CHARTER SCHOOLS**

Removes the limit on the number of charter schools that may be approved in the state. Authorizes the Department of Education and Early Development to establish and operate for a five-year period a charter school facilities construction, lease, and major maintenance grant program using federal grant funds and a state and local contribution. (HCS SB 235(FIN))

Effective Date: September 19, 2010

Chapter 92 **TAX CREDITS FOR CASH CONTRIBUTIONS BY TAXPAYERS THAT ARE ACCEPTED FOR CERTAIN EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES AND FACILITIES**

Increases the amount of contributions eligible for tax credits, increases the maximum amount of credits that may be taken, and broadens the purposes for which the contributions may be used for the years 2011, 2012, and 2013. Limits the total amount of tax credits that may be taken by an affiliated group. Requires the director of the division of insurance and the commissioner of revenue to make an annual

report of the total amount of contributions reported and the total amount of credits claimed. Effective January 1, 2014, restores the limitations on contributions, credits, and uses of contributions to those in effect in 2010 and removes the special reporting requirements for the director of the division of insurance and the commissioner of revenue. **(HCS CSSB 236(FIN))**

Effective Date: Sections 1, 2, 4, 6, 8, 9, 11 - 13, 15, 17, 19, 20, 22, 24, 26, 27, 29, 31, 33, 34, 36, 38, 40, 41, 43, 45, 47, 48, 50, 52, and 54 take effect January 1, 2011; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2014

Chapter 93 SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION AND MAJOR MAINTENANCE DESIGN AND FUNDING

Requires the Department of Education and Early Development to review plans that include projected energy consumption and costs for school construction and major maintenance. Changes, retroactively, the participating share paid by a municipal school district for school construction and major maintenance grant projects. Requires the school construction grant review committee to set standards for energy efficiency. Provides, in FY 2013 and later, additional state aid for school construction in regional educational attendance areas based on a formula that takes into account school bond debt reimbursement amounts and enrollment percentages. Indefinitely extends voter approval for bond debt reimbursement by the state for school construction outside of regional educational attendance areas. Modifies the definitions of "school construction" and "major maintenance."

(HCS CSSB 237(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: Sections 1, 3, 6, and 9 take effect June 22, 2010; section 5 takes effect July 1, 2012; remainder of Act takes effect September 19, 2010; AS 14.11.008(b), as amended by section 3 of this Act, applies retroactively to an appropriation made under AS 37.05.560 or a grant approved under AS 14.11.008(a) on or after April 1, 2008

Chapter 94 UNIVERSITY OF ALASKA DEBT AUTHORITY

Increases, from \$1,000,000 to \$2,500,000, the amount of the annual payment on a debt obligation that the University of Alaska may incur without giving prior notification to and obtaining prior approval by the Legislature. **(HB 184)**

Effective Date: September 19, 2010

Chapter 95 **GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS FOR EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES**
Authorizes general obligation bonds of the state in the principal amount of not more than \$397,200,000 to be issued and sold. Permits the bonds to be issued and sold at a public or negotiated sale, and under conditions determined by the state bond committee. Identifies university and public school projects to be financed with bond proceeds, along with the state library, archives, and museum facility, the Near Island research facility, and a vocational education center. Requires the question whether the bonds are to be issued to be submitted to the voters at the next general election. (SCS CSHB 424(FIN))

Effective Date: June 22, 2010

Chapter 96 **ALASKA HEALTH CARE COMMISSION**
Establishes the Alaska Health Care Commission in the Department of Health and Social Services for the purpose of advising the department in developing a statewide health plan. Provides for membership, meetings, and public hearings of the commission and a transition from the commission established previously by executive order. (HCS CSSB 172(FIN))

Effective Date: June 22, 2010

Chapter 97 **VALUE OF LIFE INSURANCE AND ANNUITY CONTRACT EXEMPT FROM LEVY FOR DEBT SATISFACTION**
Increases the amount of accrued dividends and loan values of unmatured life insurance and annuity contracts that is exempt from levy to satisfy a debt. (SCS CSHB 101(JUD))

Effective Date: September 19, 2010

Chapter 98 **TRAUMA CARE**
Requires the commissioner of health and social services to establish special designations for levels of trauma care provided by a certified trauma center and to set standards for state compensation. Establishes a trauma care fund to compensate trauma care centers who receive and maintain a special designation. (SCS CSHB 168(FIN))

Effective Date: June 22, 2010

Chapter 99 **EMERGENCY COMPENSATION FOR CRIME VICTIMS**
Increases the amount of emergency compensation that the Violent Crimes Compensation Board may award to a crime victim to \$5,000. (SB 266 am H)

Effective Date: September 19, 2010

Chapter 100 POSSESSION OF HANDGUNS BY FELONS

Provides that the law restricting the possession of handguns by felons does not apply to felons who have received a pardon or a set aside for their felony conviction or if 10 years have elapsed since their conviction for various felonies. Repeals the law that restricted felons from concealing a firearm on their person. (CSHB 408(JUD))

Effective Date: September 20, 2010

Chapter 101 TAXATION OF PASSENGERS TRAVELING ON COMMERCIAL PASSENGER VESSELS

Reduces the excise tax on a passenger traveling on a commercial passenger vessel from \$46 to \$34.50. Authorizes the commissioner of revenue to distribute, subject to appropriation, money from the cruise ship tax to the first seven ports of call. Limits the use of proceeds from the excise tax. Provides for a decrease in the excise tax for taxes imposed on the passenger by municipalities. Requires the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development to submit a report every three years on the needs of communities to safely and efficiently host passengers that pay the excise tax and how the needs have been met through appropriations from the tax proceeds. Provides for a review of the changes made in the Act by the 28th Alaska State Legislature after the commissioner of revenue submits a report on the administration of the excise tax. Requires proceeds from the tax on gambling operations aboard commercial passenger vessels to be deposited in a special subaccount within the commercial vessel passenger tax account. (CSSB 312(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: October 31, 2010

Chapter 102 SALMON PRODUCT DEVELOPMENT TAX CREDIT

Extends the date for which property must be placed into service in order to claim the salmon product development tax credit to December 31, 2015. Amends the definition of "qualified investment" for purposes of the salmon product development tax credit to include ice making machines. Extends the termination date of the salmon product development tax credit to January 1, 2019. (CSHB 344(FIN))

Effective Date: September 23, 2010

Chapter 103 FISHERMEN'S FUND

Redefines the duties of the commissioner relating to claims for benefits, increases the allowance for injury, and allows a vessel owner to recover a portion of the insurance deductible following a claim by an injured fisherman. (HCS SB 163(RLS))

Effective Date: June 26, 2010

Chapter 104 MUNICIPAL GENERAL GRANT LAND ENTITLEMENTS

Establishes the general grant land entitlement for the City and Borough of Wrangell at 9,006 acres and for the Haines Borough at 3,167 acres. Permits the land to be selected at any time before October 1, 2011. (CSHB 273(FIN))

Effective Date: June 26, 2010

Chapter 105 LOUIS MILLER BRIDGE

Names the bridge over Hammer Slough on Nordic Drive in Petersburg the Louis Miller Bridge. (SB 24)

Effective Date: September 23, 2010

Chapter 106 RICHARD "DEWEY" DUVALL FERRY TERMINAL

Names the South Mitkof Island ferry terminal the Richard "Dewey" Duvall Ferry Terminal. (SB 25)

Effective Date: September 23, 2010

Chapter 107 SAM SCHUYLER MEMORIAL BRIDGE

Names a bridge to be built on the Dalton Highway as the Sam Schuyler Memorial Bridge. (HB 345)

Effective Date: September 23, 2010

Chapter 108 PROVISION OF STUDENT INFORMATION TO THE ALASKA CHALLENGE YOUTH ACADEMY

Requires a public school district to provide to the Alaska Challenge Youth Academy a biannual report containing the name and contact information of students who no longer attend school in the district and who have not graduated. Requires districts to provide to the student or to the student's parent or guardian written notice and an opportunity to object to the provision of the information. Limits disclosure by the Academy of the information furnished. (SCS CSHB 360(EDC))

Effective Date: September 23, 2010

Chapter 109 TRAUMATIC OR ACQUIRED BRAIN INJURY REGISTRY AND MEDICAL ASSISTANCE

Requires the Department of Health and Social Services to collect and maintain data pertaining to traumatic or acquired brain injury and to provide optional Medicaid

services for case management services for the injury. Establishes a statewide traumatic or acquired brain injury program within the department for the purpose of evaluating the effectiveness and availability of information and services for the prevention and treatment of traumatic or acquired brain injury in the state. (CSSB 219(FIN))

Effective Date: September 23, 2010

Chapter 110 YOUTH COURTS

Authorizes the Legislature to appropriate 25 percent of criminal fines to support the operation of youth courts. (SB 257)

Effective Date: September 26, 2010

Chapter 111 AUTHORIZING COUNSELING FOR JURORS TRAUMATIZED BY GRAPHIC EVIDENCE

Authorizes a trial judge to offer limited post-trial counseling, without charge, to a juror traumatized by extraordinarily graphic, gruesome, or emotional evidence during a trial involving certain offences. (HB 52)

Effective Date: September 26, 2010

Chapter 112 ESTABLISHING THE SOUTHEAST STATE FOREST

Designates certain state-owned or acquired land in Southeast Alaska as the Southeast State Forest. Requires the commissioner of natural resources to prepare a management plan for the forest and to establish transportation corridors within the forest. Addresses the exercise of land selection rights for Wrangell and a new municipality incorporated before June 30, 2019, with regard to land in the Southeast State Forest. (SCS HB 162(RES))

Effective Date: Section 2 takes effect June 29, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2010

Chapter 113 LIENS ON VEHICLES AND CHARGES FOR TOWING, TRANSPORTING, AND STORAGE OF VEHICLES

Provides that chattel mortgages and similar encumbrances on vehicles are subordinate to towing, transporting, and storage liens on those vehicles. Modifies the procedures for notice concerning towing, transporting, and storage liens on vehicles. (CSHB 251(JUD))

Effective Date: June 29, 2010

Chapter 114 MINIMUM WHOLESALE AND RETAIL PRICES FOR CIGARETTES

Requires the Department of Revenue to determine minimum wholesale and retail prices for cigarettes. Prohibits the wholesale or retail sale of cigarettes below the minimum wholesale or retail price determined by the Department of Revenue. Requires a manufacturer to notify the Department of Revenue of a price change at least three days before the price change takes effect. (HCS CSSB 117(L&C))

Permitted to become law without signature

Effective Date: September 28, 2010

Chapter 115 ALASKA CHILDREN'S TRUST

Authorizes the appropriation of special license fees to a newly-established children's trust grant account rather than the endowment trust fund. Provides for donations and income earned on investments to be appropriated to the trust fund. Requires the commissioner of revenue to identify five percent of the trust fund as available for appropriations to the grant account. Authorizes the children's trust board to use the grant account to award grants and to expend private restricted use donations in conformity with donor restrictions, to make arrangements with a "financial depository" to manage private restricted use donations and enter into joint agreements with one or more private nonprofit entities to award grants and to raise funds, and to adopt regulations outside of the Administrative Procedure Act. (CSHB 190(FIN))

Effective Date: September 29, 2010

Chapter 116 FIRE FIGHTER, EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE PROVIDER, AND SPECIAL REQUEST FRATERNAL LICENSE PLATES

Authorizes the Department of Administration to issue fire fighter and emergency medical service provider license plates to active and former fire fighters and emergency medical service providers, and to issue special request fraternal organization license plates to members of fraternal organizations as defined in the Act. (SCS CSHB 73(FIN))

Effective Date: July 2, 2010

Chapter 117 HEALTH CARE INSURANCE: PARTICIPATION IN A CLINICAL TRIAL RELATED TO CANCER

Requires a health care insurer to cover routine patient care costs for a patient who is enrolled in an approved clinical trial related to cancer. Requires the Department of Health and Social Services to provide Medicaid services to a person participating in an approved clinical trial related to cancer. (CSSB 10(HSS)(efd del))

Effective Date: September 29, 2010

Chapter 118 OVERTIME LIMITS FOR NURSES

Establishes limits on how and in what circumstances certain health care facilities may require nurses to work more than 40 hours in a week, 14 hours in a single shift, or beyond the end of a predetermined shift. Creates a procedure for the state to enforce those limits, prohibits retaliation by employers against nurses who invoke the limits or their enforcement, and requires certain health care facilities that are subject to the limits to file semiannual reports listing the number of hours each nurse worked overtime or was on call during the reporting period. (CSHB 50(FIN))

Permitted to become law without signature

Effective Date: AS 18.20.450, enacted in section 2 of this Act, and section 3 take effect July 8, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect January 1, 2011

Chapter 119 TRANSACTIONS AFFECTING RESOURCES OF THE IZEMBEK STATE GAME REFUGE AND THE IZEMBEK NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

Authorizes an exchange of state land near Cold Bay and on Sitkinak Island for federal land to serve as a road corridor through the Izembek National Wildlife Refuge. Authorizes the construction of a road between Cold Bay and King Cove in that corridor. Adds state land and water within and adjacent to Kinzarof Lagoon to the Izembek State Game Refuge. Makes the land exchange and addition to the state game refuge contingent upon the United States Secretary of the Interior determining that the land exchange is in the public interest under sec. 6402, P.L. 111-11 (Omnibus Public Land Management Act of 2009). (SCS CSHB 210(RES))

Effective Date: Sections 1 - 6 are conditional, remainder of Act takes effect August 20, 2010

Chapter 120 COMMERCIAL FISHING LOANS

Authorizes the Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development to make loans to commercial fisherman under the Commercial Fishing Loan Act for propulsion engine or generator engine replacements on existing vessels for the purpose of improving fuel efficiency. Provides an exception to the limitation on loans when the loan is for propulsion engine or generator engine replacements on existing vessels for the purpose of improving fuel efficiency. Increases the allowable loan balance for certain commercial fishing loans to \$400,000. (SCS CSHB 20(FIN))

Effective date: August 20, 2010

Chapter 41 **OPERATING AND LOAN PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes appropriations for state fiscal year 2011 for the operating and loan program expenses of state government, for certain programs, and to capitalize funds.
(CCS HB 300)

Effective Date: Sections 35 and 37 take effect June 30, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2010; those portions of the appropriations made in section 1 of this Act that appropriate either the unexpended and unobligated balance of specific fiscal year 2010 program receipts or the unexpended and unobligated balance on June 30, 2010, of a specified account are retroactive to June 30, 2010, solely for the purpose of carrying forward a prior fiscal year balance

Chapter 43 **CAPITAL APPROPRIATIONS**

Makes and amends appropriations, including capital appropriations, supplemental appropriations, fund capitalizations, and other appropriations.
(HCS CSSB 230(FIN) am H)

Effective Date: Sections 16 and 57, and the appropriations made in sections 23(c), 23(d), 24(d), 29(c), 30(a), 36, and 38 are conditional; sections 1, 4, 10, 29(c), 31, 32(b), 34, 37, 38(a), 58, and 60 take effect June 4, 2010; sections 29(a), 29(b), 33, and 39 - 56 take effect June 30, 2010; remainder of Act takes effect July 1, 2010; sections 29(c) and 38(a) are retroactive to March 1, 2010

MEDICAL ASSISTANCE ELIGIBILITY FOR CHILDREN AND PREGNANT WOMEN

Increases the income eligibility threshold for medical assistance for children and pregnant women from 175 to 200 percent of the federal poverty line, and raises the threshold for premium payments and cost-sharing contributions for children to 200 percent. (SB 13)

OIL AND GAS PRODUCTION: TAX RATES; ALLOCATION OF ALLOWABLE LEASE EXPENDITURES FOR DETERMINING PRODUCTION TAX VALUE; PAYMENT OF THE PRODUCTION TAX; AND USE OF PRODUCTION TAX REVENUE

Provides for an increase in the tax rate applicable to the production of oil in the state, gas produced in the Cook Inlet sedimentary basin, and gas produced in the state outside of the Cook Inlet sedimentary basin that is used in the state as the average production tax value of that oil and gas production increases above \$30 a BTU equivalent barrel. Provides for an increase in the tax rate applicable to the production of gas outside of the Cook Inlet sedimentary basin and that is not used in the state as the average production tax value of that gas increases above \$30 a BTU equivalent barrel. Requires the Department of Revenue to provide for, to the extent possible, the allocation of lease expenditures and adjustments to lease expenditures in proportion to the gross value at the point of production of oil produced and gas produced. Allows exploration and development lease expenditures from nonproducing land and leases and properties to be allocated as deductible lease expenditures when determining the production tax value of oil and gas in the same area of the state. Identifies that part of the oil and gas production tax revenue that is generated by applying the tax rate applicable to oil and gas with an average production tax value of more than \$30 a BTU equivalent barrel as a source for an appropriation to the community revenue sharing fund. Makes provisions relating to tax rates, tax payments, determination of production tax value, and allocation of certain exploration and development expenditures retroactive to January 1, 2010.
(HCS CSSB 305(FIN))
